## Resolution R83-031

## ADOPTING CITY FLAG AND MOTTO

WHEREAS, it is desirable to adopt a distinctive flag and motto for the City of Keizer, Oregon, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Keizer that the following flag description, explanation and rules for display are adopted by the City of Keizer:

The standard is a royal blue and white flag, three feet hoist by four feet fly, with a yellow of gold fringe, 2-1/2 inches wide. The field of blue is outlined in the letter "K", signifying the city of "Keizer". field of blue is separated in gradients of white reflecting the progressive growth and development of the community. Three white stars are imposed on the field of blue. star is a symbol of the heavens and the divine goal to which mankind has aspired from time immemorial. The three overlapping stars express the fundamental qualities which served as the basis of the incorporation: Pride, Spirit, and Voluntarism. The year of 1982, in white numerals, announces the ascendency of the city to prominence among the other municipalities of this nation.

b. The flag is emblematic of our unity, our power, our thought and purpose as a city. The blue color is derived from the adopted colors of our first institution of secondary education, McNary High School. The student body and now the

city visualizes blue as encompassing the radiant energy of the seas and the sky. The blue field has further historical significance, identifying union with the mother country. The city now extends this union, seeking a harmonious and cooperative relationship within the State and County, and with adjacent cities. The white of the stripes is representative of purity and liberty. The fringe is an honorable enrichment only. The color yellow of gold is symbolic of supreme honor, faith and wisdom.

Guidelines for display of the City Flag will follow the traditional customs and practices observed in display of "Old Glory". The formal code of flag etiquette was adopted by the 77th United States Congress in Public Law 829-77 on December 22, 1942. It is customary to place fringe on flags when carried or used for display purposes, but considered inappropriate on flags flown from halyards or fixed flagstaffs. Suitably reduced facsimiles may be used as a seal or logo in city administration and activities. fringe is inappropriate for use in the seal or logo.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the motto of the City of Keizer is "Pride, Spirit and Voluntarism."
