## CITY OF KEIZER COMMUNITY DIVERSITY ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE MINUTES January 5, 2023, 6:00 p.m.

Vice Chair Laura Reid called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. Attendance was noted as follows:

**WELCOME TO NEW MEMBER TAMMY KUNZ:** Vice Chair Reid welcomed new member Tammy Kunz to the Committee and acknowledged receipt of resignations from Kim Freeman and Kacey McCallister.

**ELECTION OF CHAIR/VICE CHAIR:** <u>Laura Reid and Benita Picazo were elected by</u> <u>unanimous consent to serve as Chair and Vice Chair respectively</u>. Chair Reid indicated that she would inform Councilors Kohler and Husseman of resignations so that they could appoint new members.

Discussion took place regarding Council appointment of committee members vs. the standard process done through the Volunteer Coordinating Committee. Staff informed committee members that they would need to make a recommendation to Council if they want to change the process and Council would make the final decision. Following lengthy discussion and input from all members, it was agreed that the appointment process should remain unchanged. Shaney Starr suggested that a consultant could review the process and suggest improvement as well as helping the committee move forward.

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES:** <u>Shaney Starr moved for approval of the November</u> <u>Minutes. Tammy Kunz seconded. Motion passed as follows</u>: Reid, Picazo, Starr and Music in favor with Kunz and Toomes abstaining and Freeman, McCallister and Brown absent.

**APPEARANCE OF INTERESTED CITIZENS:** *R.J. Navarro* praised the committee and asked that it consider changing the City Council voting process from At-Large to District in order to be more inclusive and ensure that one Council member would be from the southeast Keizer area. He suggested that if neighborhood associations were given more money they could print flyers in multiple languages in order to communicate with a wider population and that getting participation in neighborhood association meetings would be a first step in connecting Council and City Hall with the population.

Mr. Navarro added that the Southeast Keizer Community Center has events every Friday night at the Mennonite Church where childcare and food are provided in order to support the community and help people connect with each other. Chair Reid encouraged him to tell people at the Community Center to be in touch with the Council Liaisons for the neighborhood associations so that they can get the word out.

Discussion included the need to work with the Chamber to make sure there would not be a lot of overlap with KeizerFest, working with neighborhood associations, placing booths at scavenger hunt locations, doing something similar to Neighborhood Night Out, having the event at one location vs. spread out. She noted that Buffalo Consulting out of Oregon City might be an option and suggested that the initial goal be to hire someone to work through the organizational process and then figure out what the committee would be doing over the next few years.

### An anonymous family survey was conducted at the end of the Winter Wonderland event of January, 19 2023.



### **RESULTS BASED ON SURVEY RESPONSES**
