CALL TO ORDER ~ Chair Jill Bonney-Hill called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Attendance was taken as follows:

Chair Bonney-Hill welcomed new member Lorene Moore who shared information about herself with the committee.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES ~ Sherrie Gottfried moved for approval of the October 2019 Minutes. Bob Busch seconded. Motion passed as follows: Bonney-Hill, Gottfried, Busch, and Pressey in favor with Moore abstaining, Flowers absent and one position vacant.

APPEARANCE OF INTERESTED CITIZENS

Tammy Wild, Keizer, a volunteer at the Keizer Heritage Museum at the Cultural Center noted that their regular meeting was cancelled so she was able to come to the KPIC meeting. She noted that the functions of the two (Museum and KPIC) are similar and suggested that both units work together to share resources and serve the community.

Robert Becker, Keizer, explained that he had volunteered to fill the vacant position on the committee and that he volunteers at the Museum. He explained that he has been busy uploading photographs to the Heritage Center website and invited everyone to watch the KPIC Oral History interviews by clicking the Keizer History YouTube link on their website.

PROJECTS/REPORTS

Oral History: Chair Bonney-Hill suggested that assignment of this project be postponed until the committee was fully staffed. Lorene Moore indicated that she was interested. Committee members suggested she view the interviews on the City's website to get an idea of the time commitment.

Cavalry Remount Station: Sherrie Gottfried hopes to meet with Kylie at Willamette Heritage Center in January.

Informational Signage at Keizer School: Jill Bonney-Hill and Tammy Wild reviewed proposed signage and provided additional information and clarification to committee members. Robert Becker noted that a video of the Keizer School building being moved to its current location is posted on Keizer History YouTube.

Neighborhood History/Origination of Street Names: Maria Pressey had nothing new to report but noted that she was still working on the project.

Facebook Page: Jill Bonney-Hill reported that the page is still getting likes; people are still interested.

Instagram Page: Maria Pressey reported that she is waiting to get contact information from everyone and shared her plans for the page.

Willamette University: Shannon Flowers absent – no report.

Longitude 123: No report.

Claggett Creek Watershed Council Story Map Project: Bob Busch reported that CCWSC has not moved forward on this project.

Map of Little Libraries: Bob Busch reported that he had lost his information on this project but would try to find it. There is a new Little Library on Cherry at the end of the Mennonite Church driveway. He has not followed up with Keizer United regarding the Scout that wanted to build some.

OTHER BUSINESS

Bob Busch volunteered to find out what is in the time capsule at Volcano Stadium so that the information can be shared with the City (KPIC) and the Cultural Center.

Chair Bonney-Hill informed the committee that the Donation Land Claim sign was installed. She provided additional information about the claim and marker to the committee.

COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT: Roland Herrera reported that Council approved a traffic plan for the opening of In' n Out Burger and approved a resolution supporting the League of Oregon Cities People of Color Caucus that he developed with the help of Sean O'Day. He urged everyone to pay someone's utility bill as a holiday gift and to be nice to retail workers and servers.
