**Administration:**

- The Budget Committee approved the City Manager's recommended budget for Fiscal Year 2021-22 on Thursday night. The next step will be formal adoption at the first City Council meeting in June.
- Marion County is moving back to the COVID-19 high risk category today after only a week at extreme risk.
- The recruitment for an interim City Manager is open and accepting applications until May 17, 2021 at 5:00PM. The Mid-Willamette Valley Council of Governments has partnered with the City to assist with the recruitment process. The interim City Manager will be with the City for 6-12 months and assist with the nationwide recruitment of a regular status City Manager.

**Police Department:**

- Veteran Keizer Police Officer Retires
  - Lt. Trump was hired by the Keizer Police Department on January 3, 1993, and retired on May 1, 2021. Before being hired by the Keizer Police Department, Lt. Trump was a reserve officer with the Portland Police Bureau. Lt. Trump served in many capacities; field training officer, department trainer and training coordinator, traffic team member, detective, patrol sergeant, Community Response Unit sergeant, detective sergeant, and lieutenant.

**Public Works Department:**

Marion County has received notification that the President has approved the Major Disaster Declaration request for Benton, Clackamas, Linn, **Marion**, Polk, and Yamhill counties and the Confederated Tribes of the Grand Ronde following the ice storm this past February.
