

Here is your weekly update for the week ending June 11, 2021

### **Parks & Facilities Division:**

- The stairs on Wiessner Drive that provide access to Northview Park have been replaced.
- The fall protection surfacing for the exercise stations at Keizer Rapids Park, Wallace House Park, Claggett Creek Park and Country Glen Park was completed this week.
- The Peace Poles have been placed in Ryan Hill Memorial Park, Wallace House Park and Country Glen Park.
- A sports group focus meeting was held by the consultant for the Parks Master Plan update on Thursday to receive input. The input received will be considered and incorporated into the recommendations from the consultant for consideration by the Parks Board and City Council.

### **Environmental & Technical Division:**

- Staff is finalizing the review of applications for the two vacant positions and will be scheduling interviews soon.
- Staff is preparing to launch a campaign called Trashy Tuesday as part of our public outreach and education program. This will be promoting a once a month litter clean-up citywide and is advertised on the city's web site, our Facebook page and possibly in the Keizertimes.

### **Street/Stormwater Operations Division:**

- The repairs to the failed storm drain pipe on Jack Street and on Willamette Drive are scheduled to be completed the week of June 21<sup>st</sup>.
- Staff has been contacted by FEMA to schedule an exploratory call with our Program Delivery Manager who will assist us in developing our application for Federal disaster assistance for damages from the ice storm.

### **Water Division:**

- The contractor completed painting fire hydrants in the south western portion of the city.
- PGE has completed replacing the failed power supply wire to the Wiessner Pump Station.
- Staff will be reviewing a Risk and Resilience Plan next week that has been prepared by our consulting engineer so we can submit it to the Federal government by the end of June.

### **Police Department**

- The Police Department would like to express their gratitude for the ongoing support from the City Council, Mayor, Budget Committee and Community for passing the police budget and approving the police services fee increase.

### **League of Oregon Cities Weekly Statewide Conference Call:**

- **Governor's Office:** The Governor's Office wanted to reiterate that the June 21<sup>st</sup> target date to reopen the state is not a hard date with the reopening still dependent upon having 70% of the adults in the state vaccinated. With respect to vaccinations we are seeing the number of vaccinated grow by 0.1% per day. The state is seeing that the incentives to get vaccinated are making some difference but not as much as some of the other states are seeing.
