

Councilors:

I am getting your update out to you early this week because I'm going to be out tomorrow. This is your update for the week ending 7/31/20.

Police Department:

- We recently developed several child safety ID kits from Every Second Counts, LLC, to hand out at community gatherings (when those occur again) and to individuals, as you see fit. The kits are in the hallway next to the south copier in the upper cabinet (as pictured). Each child safety ID kit includes:
 - ✓ Contact Information
 - ✓ Physical Attributes
 - ✓ Medical Information
 - ✓ Dental Charts
 - ✓ Location for Photo
 - ✓ Non-Toxic Ink Strip for Finger Prints
 - ✓ Cotton Tip Applicator and Swab box for DNA sample
 - ✓ Child Safety Tips



Public Works Department:

Parks & Facilities Division:

- The contractor has completed the additional mowing at Wallace House Park. Parks staff is coordinating with the Police Department and Code Compliance staff to determine if there are any other areas that need to be addressed.
- The Request for Proposals for the Parks Master Plan update will be advertised next Monday August 3rd, 2020. Proposals are due Friday September 4th, 2020 by 5:00pm.

Environmental & Technical Division:

- Staff spent time this week working with Marion County staff and City of Salem staff investigating source of the problem on Labish Ditch. Additional sampling has been done and we are waiting on the results. At this point there is no obvious source and the investigation continues.

Street/Stormwater Operations Division:

- Shoreline Drive was opened to traffic last Friday. The contractor will be taking care of some punch list items before we accept the project.
- The River Road paving contractor will be raising the manholes and placing the pavement markings Thursday and Friday nights. Marion County completed the striping and will paint the lines again in late September or early October.
- The final punch list for the ADA ramp project, including the traffic signal work, has been compiled and will be sent to the contractor.

Water Division:

- The Water Resources Department has completed the final review of our Water Management and Conservation Plan. They have identified some additional language for us to include in the Plan, we will be making the revision and submitting the final document to them so they can issue the final order accepting the Plan.

Administration:

- As a reminder, the 2nd story pole carving has begun. Stop by and take a look if you get a chance.
- I received a request for information about the lane striping that just took place. Specifically, there was a question regarding the significant overspray that occurred and was present after the striping. If you are asked by constituents about this, overspray happens every time our lanes are striped and is a function of the way the machine used by the County sprays the paint. It wears off very quickly leaving the main lane stripe as a clear marking.
- I won't have a summary of the LOC call this week but if you'd like to listen to it, the LOC posts a copy of it on their website after the call is finished.
